Councilman Kaczor stated that the Town received a letter from the New York State Recreation and Parks Society announcing that Recreation Director, Edward Leak has achieved the status of "Certified Park and Recreation Professional". This nationally recognized certification acknowledges the high level of dedication and competency in the field of recreation.

Town Attorney Berkowitz gave a brief report on the Association of Towns meeting in New York City and stated that he will have a full written report for the Town Board.

Highway Superintendent Piasecki stated the Highway Department is currently cutting and pushing back the snow banks in the Town. This will make for easier drainage and room to plow any new snow.

County Legislator John Mills stated that he would like the Town Board, Highway Superintendent and the Town Engineer to compile a list of County owned roads, bridges, drainage area and right of ways that are considered to be a public safety problem in the Town of Orchard Park and send it to him by the middle of March, which he will present to the County. This will serve to put the County on notice that repairs are needed. Legislator Mills also stated that Erie County and Erie Community College have come to an agreement to bring the Central Police Services Police Academy under the auspices of Erie Community College.
