#### **PUBLIC HEARING**

# 2014-2015 Federal Community Development Block Grant Funds

At 7:00 PM (local time) Supervisor Colarusso called for the Public Hearing to hear all interested parties for or against the 2014-2015 Community Development Block Grant Funds.

Affidavits of Publication and Posting of the Legal Notice of the Public Hearing were presented, read aloud, and filed with the Town Board by the Town Clerk.

Town Engineer, Wayne Bieler, stated the Town of Orchard Park may be eligible to receive Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the 2014-2015 Program Year.

The projects proposed by the Town will be placed into a competitive pool along with projects submitted by the 34 other municipalities in the Erie County CD Consortium to determine which projects best meet the goals of the HUD program. The County anticipates that Federal funding for this program year will remain at current levels with approximately \$741,000 available for community projects. There will be a cap of \$100,000 per project with a maximum of three projects funded per municipality.

Applications must be submitted to Erie County by October 28, 2013. Town Engineer Bieler recommends that the Town apply for the Draudt Road 30" Culvert Replacement and 8' x 11' Triple Culvert Concrete

Invert Installation, Orchard Park Senior Center Improvements Project, and Rural Transit Service, in that order.

The Town of Orchard Park may be eligible to receive Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the 2014 Program Year. The purpose of this public hearing is to provide an opportunity for citizens to discuss the needs of the community as outlined in the official notice.

To be eligible for CDBG funding, a proposed project must satisfy one or more of the following national objectives:

- I. BENEFIT LOW AND MODERATE INCOME PERSONS
- II. CORRECT SLUMS AND BLIGHT
- III. MEET AN URGENT COMMUNITY NEED

It is estimated that the 2014 allotment for the Erie County CDBG Consortium Communities projects will be \$741,406.00. Funds will be granted on a competitive basis to those municipalities whose projects best meet the HUD goals described above. There is a maximum grant of \$100,000 per project with a maximum of two projects funded per municipality. Applications for this year's Community Development Block Grant funds must be submitted by October 28, 2013.

Some suggested projects in the Town of Orchard Park which may qualify for funding in 2014 include:

Last year the Town submitted applications for the Senior Center Improvements, Draudt Road Culvert (Replacement & Repair) and the Rural Transit Service Program. Neither of the two Town specific projects received funding. The Rural Transit Service Program was funded.

It is likely that the Town will again submit an application for funding to continue our participation in the Rural Transit Service Program. This program provides van transportation for eligible citizens. Trips can be for any reason but are prioritized for medical and health concerns. Orchard Park has 286 registered users.

The Water Quality Improvement Projects program provides reimbursement for an eligible portion of the cost of implementing projects that include Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) Phase II Stormwater Implementation, and

**WHEREAS**, funds are intended to assist existing MS4's with newly designated Urbanized Areas with expanding the geographic area of their Storm Water Management Program. Funding will be considered for proposals submitted on behalf of multiple regulated MS4s. Preference will be given to proposals representing cooperation among MS4s, and

**WHEREAS,** the proposed project will result in mapping storm water outfalls, conducting an outfall reconnaissance inventory and mapping the system not previously mapped. The project will also, perform other related work that is needed to comply with the storm water permit GP-0-10-002, and

**WHEREAS**, Erie County Department of Environment and Planning will oversee the administration of the grant for the Western New York Storm Water Coalition members that participate. There is a resolution authorizing Erie County Department of Environment and Planning to submit an application to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation Round 11 grant Program.

## NOW, THEREFORE, be it

**RESOLVED**, that the Town Board does hereby authorize the Supervisor to sign the commitment letter to participate in the Western New York Storm Water Coalition: MS4 Assistance Project, which includes assisting newly designated MS4s with completion of a gap analysis, field verification, and GIS mapping of existing and expanded storm water outfall system. With the required matching contributions being inkind services by the Orchard Park Engineering Department personnel.

Lynn Marie Phillips – She is a candidate for Orchard Park Town Council and had issues with comments from the September 4<sup>th</sup> Town Board meeting and quotes from the September 19<sup>th</sup> edition of the Orchard Park Bee News from present Councilmembers.

11) THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY COUNCILMEMBER MAJCHRZAK, WHO MOVED ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY SUPERVISOR COLARUSSO, TO WIT:

WHEREAS, the attack of 9/11 on the World Trade Center in New York City highlighted the critical importance of modern, functioning and Interoperable communications between first responder agencies, and

WHEREAS, the shortcomings of the New York City communication systems on 9/11 lead to the deaths of many first responders who were not able to receive up to date building evacuation warnings, and

WHEREAS, in response to this situation and in an effort to fund upgrading of emergency communications systems throughout the state, New York passed, in 2002, an increase in its cell phone surcharge from \$.70 per month to \$1.20 per month on all cell phones usage in the state, and

WHEREAS, this increase was intended to be shared with local governments for the purposes of funding operations of 911 call centers and technology upgrades, and

WHEREAS, in 2011, New York State collected approximately \$190 million from this surcharge and shared only \$9.3 million with local governments and historically has averaged sharing just 6% of the total revenue collected, and

WHEREAS, County governments have been forced to raise property and/or sales taxes to make up for this diversion of funds in order to pay for necessary emergency call center operations and technology upgrades, and

**WHEREAS**, legislation has been submitted in the New York State Legislature by Senator Grisanti and Assemblyman Scarborough to increase the amount of funds shared with local governments to 58.3% of the total collected by the state each year, and

WHEREAS, Counties and first responder agencies from across the state will be mounting a coordinated effort to see that this bill is passed and signed into law during the 2013 legislative session,

## NOW, THEREFORE, be it

**RESOLVED,** that the Town Board of Orchard Park is on record supporting the passage of this bill for increased revenue sharing of the E-911 surcharge with local governments, and be it further

**RESOLVED,** that the Town Board of Orchard Park is committed to dedicating any and all funds shared by New York State from the E-911 surcharge for the use in funding emergency call center operations and technology upgrades of this county's emergency communications system, and be it further

**RESOLVED,** that a copy of this resolution will be communicated to the members of the Western New York Senate and Assembly delegation, the Governor and the Lieutenant Governor.
