### **BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR**

David Jensen – At a July meeting he asked about 3964 California Road, at which a garage structure was made over into a public assembly use structure without Planning Board or Town Board approval. He wants to know whose authority has allowed this to happen, and who issued the pemit for this to be done without the proper procedures being followed. Mr. Jensen also commented on a large pile of garbage at 5330 Big Tree Road, which is next to the stadium parking, that has been there for over three weeks. They park cars for the games and Mr. Jensen believes that the requirements for parking cars is a 24 hr. clean up after a game. He wanted to know if the Town would be able to stop them from parking if the property is not maintained in the proper manner.

#### **ELECTED OFFICIALS & DEPARTMENT HEADS**

Supervisor Keem said that the Holiday time is upon us and there will be many parties that people are going to be attending and a lot of family functions. He just wanted to remind people to think twice about drinking and getting behind the wheel of a vehicle. Please take the time to set a designated driver, or call a taxi to get home. Personally he has a nephew that was killed by a drunk driver, and the family never gets over it. So don't drink and drive.

Building Inspector Andy Giest stated that they have been looking into 5330 Big Tree Road. There was a notice of violation and an appearance ticket was issued, so the gentleman will have to appear in court about that. But as of 2:00pm this afternoon all the garbage is gone. Mr. Giest said he thought that property is zoned R-3, within one mile of the stadium, and does not require a permit to park cars for the games.

Police Chief Pacholec stated that there are three events this coming weekend. First, there is the Bills game on Sunday, and on Saturday, there is the Holly Jolly run, which begins at Orchard Fresh at noon. There is also the Holiday Parade at noon, which goes from the Library to the old Orchard Lanes, so S. Buffalo Street will be closed for about ½ hour.

Highway Superintendent Piasecki said that with the good weather they still have crews out picking up leaves and brush.
