1) THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY SUPERVISOR KEEM, WHO MOVED ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER SHERRY, TO WIT:

RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby call for a Special Session Meeting, to award the following Resolution.

New Business #1 Award Bid for Forest Drive Project

THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY COUNCILMEMBER MAJCHRZAK, WHO MOVED ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER SHERRY, TO WIT:

WHEREAS, bids were opened for the Forest Drive Bridge Replacement Project on March 6, 2014 at 1:00 PM. The project scope of work involves the complete replacement of the Forest Drive Bridge with a precast unit and all associated road work, drainage work, safety, E&S, signage, landscaping, etc. as shown of the plans and specifications. An alternate was also included for the approach/bridge stone and asphalt work, and

WHEREAS, the consultant, Greenman-Pedersen, Inc., and the Town of Orchard Park Engineering Department have reviewed the itemized prices of the seven (7) contractors who submitted bids. A few very small errors were discovered which did not involve the lowest bidder or the ranking of the bidders. Concrete Applied Technologies Corporation (CATCO) was the lowest responsible bidder with a base bid and alternate #1 of \$896,761.32 that was below the engineer's estimate of \$1,125,108.56 for the project, and

WHEREAS, Greenman-Pedersen has completed the required "Award Package" for the NYSDOT and the grant. The extensive award package includes award documentation certification, cost data, proof of advertising, memorandum of bids, verification of low bidder, recommendation for award, signed proposal of the verified low bidder, debarment history certification, bid analysis, bidders good faith DBE effort, certification of low bidder responsibility, ROW clearance certificate, addendum #1, construction management plan and bridge cost data. NYSDOT has granted award approval on 3/26/14, and

WHEREAS, attached is an extended tabulation of bid results showing the itemized bid amounts of each contractor, and

WHEREAS, Concrete Applied Technologies Corporation (CATCO) has successfully completed bridge projects in the Town of Orchard Park for various government agencies (NYSDOT & ECHD). Concrete Applied Technologies Corporation has been found to have the qualifications and

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experience to perform this work adequately. Concrete Applied Technologies Corporation (CATCO) has been in business since 1995. The NYSDOT, Greenman-Pedersen and I have no reservation about their capabilities, and

WHEREAS, there is presently \$989,578.82 plus interest allocated under Capital Project H-68 "Forest Avenue Bridge Replacement" for this project. This is a Federal Aid project with 80% Federal Aid and 20% local match. Marchiselli funds have been awarded for \$131,000 for the first grant, which will bring the Town's portion to 5%. Marchiselli funds have been applied for the remaining project but have not been granted to date.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby award the Contract for the Forest Drive Bridge Replacement Project to the lowest responsible bidder, Concrete Applied Technologies Corporation (CATCO), 1266 Townline Road, Alden, New York 14004 in the amount of \$896,761.32 (Base Bid = \$833,792.32 and Alternate #1 = \$62,969.00).

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

There being no further business at 6:15 pm on a motion duly made by Councilmember Majchrzak, seconded by Supervisor Keem, the Special Session Meeting was close.
